Two workshops on strategies for supporting adolescent learners with IEPs

Session 1 • Fri. 11/30, 4:30-6pm

IEP and Advocacy: In this workshop we will focus on the IEP as an advocacy tool for students and their families in the middle and high school years. Specifically we will discuss the role of the IEP in transitions from middle school to high school and high school to post secondary schooling and/or employment. We will practice the writing of effective IEP's to ensure student success, including present performances, goals and supplemental services, and discuss how to effectively engage guidance counselors, teachers, and other school personnel to support student success.

Session 2 • Fri. 12/14, 4:30-6pm

IEP and Independence: In this workshop we will focus on the assistive technologies, supports, scaffolding and differentiation techniques to promote independence and advocacy for students with low incidence disabilities. Participants will have an opportunity to explore various assistive technologies and resources towards this end. A discussion of effective instructional strategies for including students with low incidence disabilities as well as using the IEP to support their success beyond the classroom will be included.
